A huge welcome to all of our new families and welcome back to all of our existing families! I hope you all had a lovely summer break and created some lovely family memories together. The children have returned to school really positively this week and there was a great buzz of learning around the school on Tuesday morning when we all came back together. The other buzz around school was the children's reaction to all the improvement work that has gone on around the school over the 6 week break. Mr Young has done a magnificent job in updating and modernising the communal areas around the main building, as well as altering the design of the Y3 block. I am sorry to have to moan in my very first newsletter but I received the following email from a local resident yesterday. As our vision is to "Love your neighbour as you love yourself", please can I urge all parents to park with consideration for others. We advise parents to park either in the community cen-

*Good afternoon*

*I am sorry to already have to be complaining about parking on the first day back to school.*

*I live on Frimley green road and this morning 3 cars were parked outside my house next to each other blocking the pavement so families had to walk near the road to get past.*

*I had to reverse out my drive with a completely blocked view and although I was careful, 3 children on bikes and 4 walking were passing and had I not been vigilant could have been hit.*

*It is very unsafe, let alone illegal as there is double yellow lines on the road and I am told by the police, this makes it illegal to park.*

*I have lived here 18 years and this is a regular occurrence which we understand happens at every school. But I was hoping that you might be able to address this with your parents early in the term, before something bad happens that I'm sure no one wants.*
