

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THEATRE FUN FACTS

The theatre is used for many different types of performances, including plays, opera, ballet, pantomimes, dance and more.



Theatre performances have directors, producers, writers, set designers, lighting designers, makeup artists, costume designers and many more people working backstage, as well as the performers on stage. Many performances also involve live music, played by an orchestra.



Before the 1500s, plays were usually performed by travelling actors. It was around <u>Shakespeare</u>'s time that theatres began being widely built for plays to be performed in.



World Theatre Day is held every year on March 27th to celebrate theatre, culture and the arts.



London's theatre district is known as the 'West End.' New York's theatre district is known as 'Broadway.'



One of the most successful West End plays is the musical 'Les Miserables.' It has been performed over 13,000 times!



One of the most successful Broadway plays is the musical 'The Lion King.' It has made over one billion pounds!



Some of the most famous British playwrights include: William Shakespeare, Harold Pinter, Alan Bennett, Tom Stoppard and Noel Coward.



Some of the most famous American playwrights include: Arthur Miller, Tennessee Williams and David Mamet.



There are 39 theatres in London's West End and 41 theatres on Broadway.

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Year 4 Electricity



As part of their learning on electricity, year 4 received a visit from STEM ambassador, Richard.

Richard spoke about his career in electrical engineering and about how important electricity is in the world of work before leading a circuits workshop. The children impressed Richard with their knowledge of complete circuits and they explored conductors and insulators and whether certain materials completed or broke their circuits.

Coming Soon at Frimley

- The children will be learning about different careers at Christmas.
- Year 5 will be learning about how historians use artefacts to learn about the past.
- Year 3 will be learning about some different careers in geography.
- Year 6 will be learning about product design and engineering.
