Clubs update: As I have mentioned previously, it is very time consuming for our lovely office staff to call parents to check where children are if they do not attend a club that they have signed up for. We often have around 8-10 children per day who are in school but do not attend their club meaning it's often down to one person in the office to make those calls to every family to check the children are safe with you at home. As I am sure you can appreciate, this is time consuming and could leave a child vulnerable. We have reviewed our processes and are now asking for you to do the following:

Attending a club run by our staff/parents: let the school office know if your child is not attending.

- If you are phoning the school office in the morning to report your child as absent from school due to illness, please also report that they should have been attending a club that day.
- If your child is in school but, for some reason, not attending a club, please call the office to let them know this in advance of 3.00.

Attending a club run by an external provider: let them know directly if your child is not attending.

- It is the club leader's responsibility to contact parents if a child does not turn up for a club that they are expected at.

Thank you for your support with this to ensure every child is safe and accounted for.

## The Big Soup


