School Improvement

As a school, we regularly identify and review a series of priority areas and these form our Quality Improvement Plan (QIP). We have worked on this with all staff and various members of The Prospect Trust and our 8 priority areas for 2023-2025 at Frimley are:

1. Every learner is provided with the opportunity to make progress and achieve high success rate through the KS2 curriculum.

2. Every teacher is confident in teaching disadvantaged learners (including the bottom 20%) and delivers a curriculum that enables them to make maximum progress.

3. Reduce the number of incidents of poor behaviour beyond the classroom by having high expectations at all times.

4. All children actively participate in all lessons.

5. All members of the school community are provided with timely and appropriate support in order to help support their well-being and help them to flourish.

6. The school is visible within, and open to, the local community to promote the school as "school of choice" within the local area.

7. All leaders take accountability and are responsible for school wide improvements.

8. Establish wider and global links in order to develop all members of the school community as global citizens and courageous advocates.

Our progress towards these areas is reviewed with staff at various points throughout the year and an example of some of the things we have worked on (and are continuing to work on) this year include: Enrichment days based on Honesty and Equity, Diversity, Inclusion and Justice (EDIJ) Embedding a scheme of work for Phonics across the whole of the school Teacher CPD on further developing teacher craft in adaptive teaching and developing independent practise Focus on times tables progression with a new programme introduced across the school Fantastic SATS results and progress measures for the 22-23 Y6 cohort Introduced a Reflection room and Values vouchers for break and lunchtimes All teachers take part in regular learning walks and "triads" where they can learn from outstanding practise within the school High uptake of the Junior Dukes initiative Lunch club set up, which is well attended Staff working alongside parents to organise a festival for all families in the summer term Supporting Breck Foundation as our chosen charity this year: sessions led on online safety for children and parents, as well as weekly Tech Thursday sessions for the whole school Regular support for specific children and their families by the Mental Health Support Team Sponsoring a boy in a Church School in Kenya – regular input in whole school worship about him Regular visits by the community crew to local pre school Choir singing at local events, including the first Prospect Trust concert at the Sixth Form College Successful SIAMs Inspection in December 23 Range of pupil councils established As you can see, we still have lots we want to work on but I feel extremely proud of all that we are doing to try to make Frimley an ever better place to work and learn.
