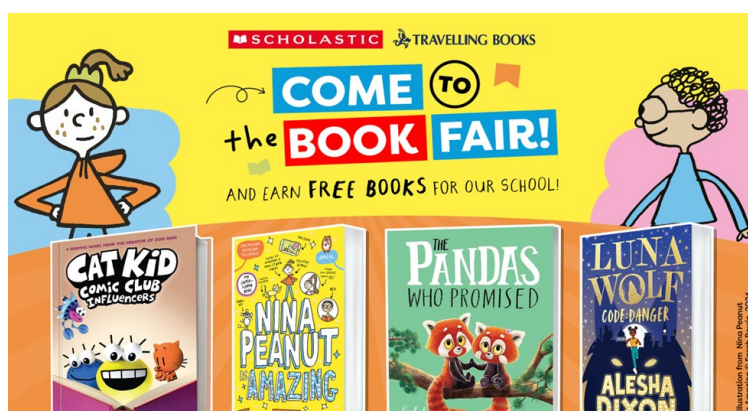
Healthy Eating
