Attendance: As you are all aware, we focus a lot on the importance of good attendance and the impact this has on your child's education. Below is an analysis of the link between attendance and Y6 SATs results from last year's Frimley cohort; this has shown the direct correlation between attendance and progress so I do urge you to think carefully before taking your child out of school for an avoidable reason (ie holiday):
