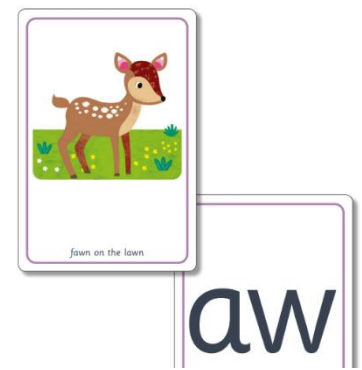

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Year 3 Phonics and Reading



- In class, children will continue to build upon their phonics knowledge gained in their previous schools.
- At Frimley, we use Essential Letters and Sounds (ELS) to support reading and spelling across the school.
- Some children, who may need additional support, will attend a phonics intervention group with Mrs Phillips, and will be allocated a decodable reading book.
- If your child receives one of these books, it is really important that they read this book as it will reinforce the learning covered in their group.
- All children will be benchmarked to assess their reading fluency and their understanding of what they are reading. They may bring home a colour banded book for you to read together. These are brown, and lime colours.
- All home reading must be recorded on Boom Reader (our online reading diary).

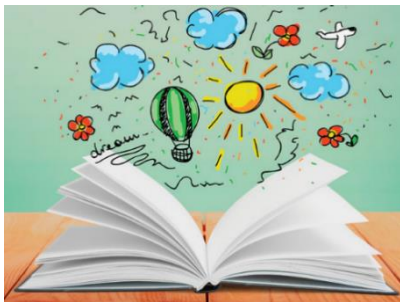


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Homework

- Times Tables Rockstars – 15 minutes per week
- Reading – at least 10 minutes 3 x a week to an adult but as often as possible recorded on **Boom Reader**.
- Set every Monday. To be completed by the following Monday.

Why do we set homework?



- develops independence,
- develops good learning habits,
- helps children to remember things,
- can improve time management and organisation,
- develops positive attitudes towards learning- learning occurs beyond the classroom,
- gives children additional time to learn and remember things,
- and has many other benefits...

Evidence tells us that children who do homework make on average **3+ months more progress** than their peers.

How you can help:

- Have a dedicated space for your child to do homework and structures help- make it the same time each week if possible.
- Praise your child for their efforts.
- Contact your child's teacher if you are concerned about any aspect of homework.



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PE and Sport

Children need to wear their full PE kit to school (both outdoor and indoor) on our PE days.

PE is on a Monday and Wednesday.

Please ensure earrings are removed or taped over on PE days.



PPA Cover Teachers

Teacher's PPA time will be every Thursday morning or afternoon, in this time your child will be taught by a different member of teaching staff. This will be Mrs Chappelow, Mrs Whiting or Miss Hill.

These lessons will be on a two week rotation. Your child will have two weeks in a row with one teacher and then classes will swap over and work with another teacher for two weeks.



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The behaviour system

Our emphasis for behaviour is:

- Celebrating the successes of our children
- Focusing on **positivity**; the praising and reinforcement of good behaviour and good work ethic
- Closely linking praise with our **school values**
- Earning rewards, both individually (praise points and values vouchers) and collaboratively (class rewards)

We have a set of **Golden Rules**, again linked to our school values.

Children can earn points for themselves and their House teams. These are called **Praise Points**.

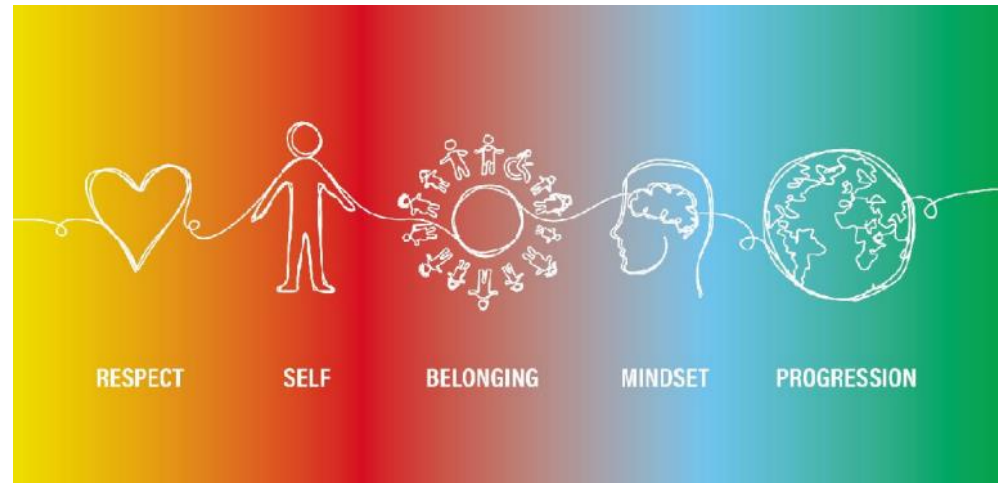
We have a lunchtime reflection room where children will go if they need to think about their behaviour choices. They have an opportunity to discuss these with a member of staff.



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Lifelong Learners...

The Frimley Learner passport supports the development of the attributes required to be a successful learner in year 3 and beyond. The passport aims to encapsulate who your child is, captures their achievements throughout the year, encourages self reflection and celebrates their successes.



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Uniform

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Painting shirt or apron

Children will take part in art lessons at various points throughout the year.

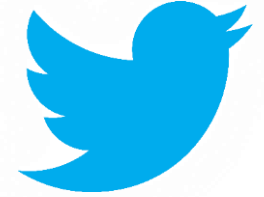
Dates for diaries
