Within our school we promote an atmosphere which encourages effort, enjoyment and a celebration of the achievements of all our pupils. Our focus on these high standards is also reflected in the pride we take in our school uniform and the feeling of belonging it creates.

It is our school policy that all children wear school uniform when attending school or when participating in a school organised event outside of normal school hours.

The uniform is part of our school ethos and in coming to Frimley, parents agree to support our policy.

### **Aims and Objectives**

Our policy for uniform is based on the belief that school uniform:

- Promotes a sense of pride in the school and it has a positive impact on behaviour and attitudes in school;
- Develops a sense of community and belonging towards the school;
- Identifies children with our school when taking part in out of school educational activities and visits;
- Is practical and looks smart;
- Makes children feel equal to others in terms of appearance;
- Is not distracting in class (as fashion clothes and hairstyles can be);
- Is regarded as suitable wear for school and considered by most parents as good value for money;
- Is designed with health and safety in mind.

All other items can be bought from a variety of shops and supermarkets at a reasonable price.

If any parents do have any difficulties then please contact the school for support and guidance.

Items of good quality, second hand uniform are often available for purchase. Please ask the office for information.

Remember to mark any clothing with names. The school cannot accept any responsibility for misplaced clothing but, if clothing is clearly marked, will make every effort to see lost items are returned.

**Please reduce the 'risks' by ensuring that every garment or piece of clothing (including footwear) is clearly marked with your child's name and surname.**

Our school uniform consists of:

Shirt - white shirt (not polo T-shirt)

Ties – with House colour stripe (can be clip on)

Top – school logo sweatshirt/cardigan

Trousers/skirt/shorts - charcoal grey

Socks/tights – plain charcoal grey

Shoes - plain, black, school shoes. No trainers,

'trainer like' footwear, boots or open toed sandals

*Summer term (optional alternative):*

Dress - blue/white checks (white socks can be worn with a summer dress)

### **PE Kit**

Plain royal blue shorts

Blue school t-shirt with logo

Tracksuit bottoms or leggings

(optional) navy blue or black

PE hoodie – Frimley logo royal blue  
Suitable footwear – Trainers

*Children should wear their PE kit to school and remain in it all day on their allocated PE day.*

### **Swimming:**

Girls must wear a one piece swimming costume.

Boys must wear close fitting trunks.

All children must wear a swimming hat.

### **Jewellery:**

For Health and Safety reasons jewellery should not be worn. If ears are pierced, earrings should be a small stud. A watch may be worn. Earrings should be removed or taped over (by the child themselves) for PE to comply with the school's health and safety requirements.

Watches should be removed prior to PE lessons, to prevent them causing injury.

### **Hair:**

Hairstyles should be reasonable and appropriate for being in a learning environment at school. If hair is longer than collar length it should be tied back with a suitable, small tie/band.

Extreme hairstyles which include shaved patterns in the scalp and unnaturally coloured dyes are not acceptable at school.

### **Make-up:**

Make-up is not acceptable, including nail varnish.

Fake tattoos are not appropriate at school and must be removed.

### **Role of the Head teacher**

The Head teacher:

- Implements and monitors the policy throughout the school community;
- Has overall responsibility for ensuring standards are maintained;
- Issues letters to parents / carers as required.

### **Role of the Staff**

The staff will:

- Support the head teacher in maintaining high standards of uniform;
- Provide role models in the wearing of appropriate clothing;
- Make discreet enquiries when children fail to wear school uniform.

### **Role of the Parents / Carers**

The Parents will:

- Support the School Uniform Policy;
- Ensure children come properly dressed and ready for their daily schoolwork every day;
- Ensure all items of clothing are clearly named – this helps lost items be easily identified and returned.

### **Role of the Children**

The Children will:

- Wear the school uniform when attending school, representing the school or when participating in a school organised event outside normal school hours;
- Wear the school uniform with pride;
- Try to keep their uniform clean and tidy;

Remember to wear PE kit on the correct days.

**Non-compliance with the School Uniform Policy**

If a child breaches the uniform policy, a member of staff will talk to them to find out why they are not in uniform and to remind them of the need to wear one.

Where appropriate, the following steps will be implemented.

**Stage 1:** An informal letter will be sent home to parents.

**Stage 2:** A member of the leadership team may contact parents / carers to bring some suitable uniform to school.

**Stage 3:** Persistent non-compliance: the Head teacher may contact the parent directly to discuss this matter.

Exclusion is not normally an appropriate response to breaches of school uniform policy. However, where these breaches are persistent and in open defiance of the school's uniform policy, and where all other avenues have been exhausted, then the school may consider exclusion as a last resort depending on the circumstances of the case.

We understand that there may be some exceptional and unavoidable situations where children may have to come to school without a part of their school uniform (lost or damaged) then we ask parents to contact us on the day to confirm the reason.
