Dear Parents,

Wow, it's the end of the half-term already.... They do say time flies when you're having fun!! I know all the children are exhausted – as are all the staff – as it's been a very full-on start to the academic year. So many fun activities and learning opportunities have already happened and I know there's lots more planned for next half-term too.

Parents Evening: Last week was our parent consultation meetings and I do hope you found these conversations useful; I know the teachers really do value the opportunity to have a 3-way dialogue with yourselves and the children. We do not want to face the awkwardness of turning children away in the morning so please do book in advance moving forward.

Tomlinscote visits: Last week, Mrs Farage, Mrs Williams and I spent the day at Tomlinscote: meeting with teachers and subject leaders; observing lessons; talking to pupils and looking at books. It was a great opportunity for us to further our understanding of what life is like at a Secondary School and was really informative for us in planning how to develop our own curriculum moving forward.

Parent forum: A huge thank you to the parents who attended our first parent forum of the year last week. It was good to get some feedback on how we communicate with parents, mainly focusing on what information we share prior to our Y3 cohort starting with us etc. We will amend and tweak our practice for next year in the light of this feedback. Following other discussions at this forum, we will continue to send home letters/newsletters on Thursday and are planning to increase the number of posts on our social media sites. Thank you to the parents who have volunteered to be class reps, following my request in my last newsletter. Unfortunately, only 2 parents have volunteered so it looks like we won't be able to pursue this option.

Tomorrow is the last day of half-term; we finish at the normal time of 3.25 after the whole school has been to St Peters Church for our annual Harvest Festival, which is being led by our Year 4 team. They will be dismissed as normal as we will all be back at school by the end of the school day. We have INSET day on Monday 31st October where all staff will be taking part in safeguarding training. Term therefore restarts after the half-term break on Tuesday 1st November for all children.
