As we approach the half-way point of this academic year, life at Frimley has been as busy as ever, with the teachers continuing to plan a variety of exciting learning opportunities for all of our children, some of which can be seen on our various social media sites. Enrichment Day: Tomorrow is our second Enrichment Day of this academic year. The focus for this day is Careers: Aiming High. Mr Phillips has organised the day and has arranged for lots of different people to come in and lead workshops with children about their careers. I know this is going to be a really informative day

and thank you to the parents who have volunteered to come in to talk to the children. The children will be working in their normal classes for the day tomorrow but can wear their house colour T-shirts with the rest of their normal school uniform if they'd like to, like they usually do on Enrichment Day. We also have the Rt Hon Michael Gove, MP for Surrey Heath, visiting the school on Friday where he will be interviewed by some of our Y6 Ambassadors about his career.

Uniform: We are all noticing that we have an increasing number of children who are not wearing the full correct uniform to school – please check the website if you are unsure of what they are expected to wear. I did speak to the children in assembly about this last week but we do need your support with this. If your child cannot wear a specific item of uniform for a medical reason, please do contact the class teacher so they are aware. We have a number of children wearing 'base layers' under their uniforms – while I understand this might be due to cold weather, it is not appropriate to wear them under short shirt sleeves and shorts. If children are not warm enough in their shorts/shirt, then they should wear trousers and a jumper rather than a 'base layer' which can be seen and it is not part of our uniform. After half-term, we will be giving a letter to any child not wearing the correct uniform which we would ask you to sign to say you've read and then return the letter to school. If you need specific uniform items due to them being lost or outgrown, there will be a 2nd hand uniform sale on the astro after school tomorrow, run by our PTa volunteers.

Cancer Research challenge: You might recall, from a previous newsletter, that I signed up to the "100 skips a day in February" challenge to raise money for Cancer Reaearch. Thank you to the parents who have kindly sponsored me for this. You might have noticed that I have had my arm in sling for a few days now after having an operation on my finger last week. I still do intend to carry on with my challenge despite being told by the Dr on Tuesday not to hold/turn a skipping rope!
