It also pays for any new pollinator friendly plants that may need purchasing and bird seed to attract in the birds to help keep the garden pests in check.

As a school, we regularly identify and review a series of priority areas and these form our Quality Improvement Plan (QIP). We have worked on this with all staff and various members of The Prospect Trust and our 6 priority areas for 2021-2024 at Frimley are:


Prepare children for life and learning so they can achieve their potential Tackle growing inequalities Harness the power of technology Support the well-being of the whole school community Root our school at the heart of the community Strengthen capacity through collaboration

Our progress towards these areas is reviewed with staff at various points throughout the year and an example of some of the things we have worked on (and are continuing to work on) this year include:

- Enrichment days based on Identity and Careers
- Embedding a scheme of work for Phonics across the whole of the school
- Introduced new books for each subject and every child now writing in pen
- Crucial learning' statements identified to enable greater sequencing of the curriculum subjects
- Further developing the Well-being zone
- Promoting reading at home through the introduction of Boom Reader and incentives for children who are reading regularly at home
- A group of parent volunteers supporting in school
- Introduced a new "Frimley Passport" which the children work on throughout the year
- More careers focussed events: trips, visiting speakers, Careers Day
- Improved links with local Churches: regular acts of worship in school; visits to St Peters and St Andrews
- Online Safety Workshops for children and parents
- 'Mental Health Support Team' working in school with children and their families and offering workshops for parents
- Monthly coffee meetings for parents

World Book Day


A reminder that next Thursday (2nd March) is World Book day and we have lots of book themed events happening at school – these were all included in a letter sent to all parents on 26th January.
